Course Description (structure/delivery)

YEAR 11 COURSE:

- A look at the characteristics and importance of religion in people's lives AND Aboriginal Spirituality.
- Examines Ancient Religions with the chance to study one of your own choice in 2 unit.
- A look at the origins, principal beliefs, sacred stories, ethics and practices of Buddhism and Islam.

YEAR 12 COURSE:

A look at religion in Australia post WWII.

Examines Religion versus no religion as a world view in 2 unit.

Study significant people, practices and ethical dilemas of three religious traditions in 2 unit and two religious traditions in 1 unit.
