## FROM THE DIRECTOR

Each year the college compiles an annual report. The primary focus of the annual report is to provide you with an account of the college's progress towards achieving the strategic directions identified in the school plan. The annual report features a summary of the college's ongoing self-assessment of the impact of the key strategies that lead to growth in student learning. It provides an account of the impact of budgetary expenditure on the achievement of equity. It also includes assessment of the college's progress in learning, teaching and leading using the School Excellence Framework. The report incorporates information and evidence as required under the National Education Reform Agreement 2013 (NERA) and enacted in the Australian Education Regulation 2013.

A new School Plan for 2018-2020 has also been collaboratively developed. We have three new strategic directions. The first is to "foster student engagement and ownership of their learning", which has a focus on building the capacity of our senior students for achievement and adult responsibility. The second strategic direction is to "build teacher effectiveness and collegiality", which aims to promote professional dialogue and growth that will benefit the whole school community. The third is to "improve and streamline communication between students, staff and parents", with the goal of creating the most cohesive and inclusive environment possible.
