On the 11th August, 30 students, parents, teachers and community members enjoyed spending a week at the University of Queensland's Heron Island Research Station.

We engaged in many and varied activities each day, starting with watching the sunrise at 6am followed by the mandatory morning swim and then some exercise on the beach– all before breakfast. After breakfast each day we were privileged to be able to use the Research Station's boats to snorkel and SCUBA at some amazing sites on the Great Barrier Reef. We saw some incredibly beautiful features at places like Coral Gardens, Blue Pools and Wistari Reef as well as some sombre sights – care of coral bleaching.

We were lucky to have a guided tour of the coral reef and handle some tropical sea creatures such as the epaulette shark as well as examining a number of rare species in the Research Station's touch tank. We also viewed some of the scientific research being conducted by the University.

Each day we spent some time working on our projects which was a practical and fun way of learning outside the conventional classroom.

Each night we planned our activities for the next day and had fun viewing everybody's photos and videos from that day.

Thanks to all the other students who came along and made it a fun and valuable learning experience.

INFORMATION FOR YEAR 12

Return of Textbooks

As students sit for their HSC exams, they are asked to return their textbooks and leave them in the trolley provided outside the exam room – **please don't leave it until your last exam.** Prompt return of textbooks will enable them to be issued to Year 11 students, who commence HSC courses in Week 1 of Term 4. **Please do not return textbooks to teachers.**

At the completion of all HSC exams, students are asked to complete the Leaver's Clearance form (included in their portfolio). The book bond will be refunded and the college Reference posted home upon completion of the Leaver's Clearance form.

This year our **Year 12 Graduation ceremony** will be held on Tuesday, 19 September at C.ex Coffs, Vernon Street, Coffs Harbour commencing at 11 am. **There are no Year 12 classes on this day.** Students are to be at the venue by 10 am. Every Year 12 student will receive a portfolio containing their Final HSC Report, last minute information regarding careers, together with any awards or certificates that they have won. There is a dress code for this ceremony and was provided to students at the graduation rehearsal.

The **Year 12 Formal** will be held at the Coffs Harbour Racing Club, Howard Street, Coffs Harbour on Wednesday, 20 September commencing at 6 pm and finishing at 11 pm.

The function is open to Year 12 students and those Pathways students who are completing their HSC this year. The Year 12 Formal is alcohol free.

Normal classes will run on Wednesday 20 September, Thursday 21 September and Friday 22 September.

HSC Exams

Support for Year 12 will continue throughout the entire examination period. College staff and campus facilities are available during this time so please make use of them as you require.

Some final tips for your HSC preparation:

 Read your timetable carefully and make sure that you know when and where your exams are scheduled. If by any chance you miss an examination contact the Director immediately.

- Be prepared by reading the equipment list for each of your subjects. Know what you are entitled to take into the examination and what you cannot.
- Use all of the examination time and don't leave any questions unanswered.
- Attempt all questions required.
- Manage your exam time so that you devote appropriate time to each question relative to the mark value.


If you cannot attend an examination because of illness or misadventure, or if you do attend but are sick or something happens that affects your performance, you are entitled to lodge an appeal. If you do intend to do this you must see the Director to get the appropriate appeal form as soon as possible. In most cases a doctor's certificate will be required in cases of illness.

YEAR 11 – RETURN OF TEXTBOOKS

Preliminary textbooks still being used during the HSC course will be reissued on the spot to students. HSC books will not be issued to students until their Preliminary books have been returned for each course. Food Technology uniforms no longer required also need to be returned.



ANZAC MEMORIAL CENTENARY PROJECT SOIL COLLECTION CENOTAPH



Aleisha Bradbury and Nikita Snoek (Year 11 students) attended the Anzac Soil Collection at the Cenotaph Coffs Harbour Ex Services Club on August 21, 2017 for display at the renovated Hyde Park War Memorial in Sydney. The War Memorial is currently undergoing significant restoration and the soil sample collected from Coffs Harbour will be displayed on a Memorial Wall in the Hall of Service to be opened in November 2018. There will be a plaque and soil sample displayed alongside over 1600 other sites from around NSW to represent the



places volunteers joined up for military service in World War One.

At the ceremony various dignitaries were present including the Deputy Premier John Barilaro, The Minister for Veteran Affairs, local MP Andrew Fraser and Mayor Denise Knight. Aleisha and Nikita met many of these people and were worthy ambassadors to the College and also being recent participants in the Anzac Ambassador Program Essay Competition.

WELCOME TO YEAR 12 PROGRAM

Wednesday 11th October will be the official change over from Year 11 into Year 12. The purpose of the day is to inform students about the next twelve months of study and highlight methods of achieving success in the HSC.

One of the most important methods for achieving success in the HSC is effective organisation. To address this key factor all students will be issued with their assessment handbook which has relevant information regarding assessment tasks for all HSC subjects. The session will commenced at 10.50am in D – Theatre with a short address and welcome by our SRC president and our Director, Dianne Marshall.

David Bateman, Assistant Director and Lynda Shrubb, Careers Advisor will be providing an information session on the HSC moderating process, Careers website/ facebook and the procedure for Illness & Misadventure process. Students will also be given an insight into the NESA requirements and the importance of individual ranks in the HSC. The ATAR process will also be explained.

Following this, Vicki Greer will highlight some valuable study tips along with a number of ways to build and maintain resilience between now and the HSC Exams.

The students will then break into mentor sessions where each student will be issued with their new Yr12 Timetable and have the opportunity to transfer key assessment dates onto a 12-month wall planner that is designed to be displayed in a regular place of study.

Lunch, along with activities will be provided before the students commence HSC classes at 2pm.
