ATTENDANCE

Parents can request a leave pass to be issued throughout the day. These requests can be made in writing or by phone. All leave passes must be approved by the deputy principal and students must collect their approved leave pass from the front office.

Parents should apply for leave via the principal if the student will be absent for an extended period. The leave must meet the 'justified' purpose criteria and approval is at the discretion of the principal.

- If a child is representing the school in a sporting or other activity, the student will be marked "on school business".
- During teacher strikes, School Development Days or natural disasters a special circumstance register is to be kept for students who are in attendance.
